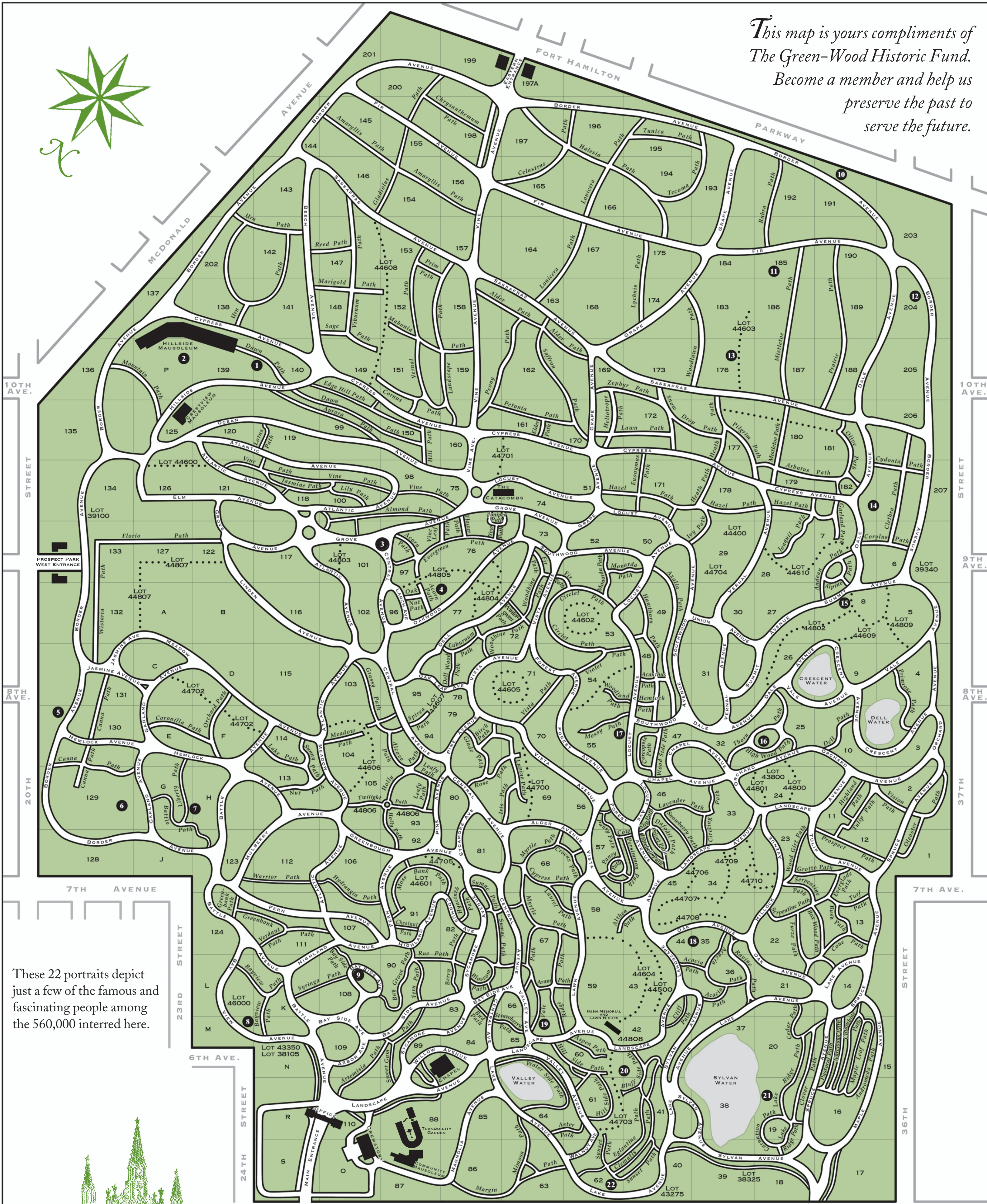

These 22 portraits depict just a few of the famous and fascinating people among the 560,000 interred here.

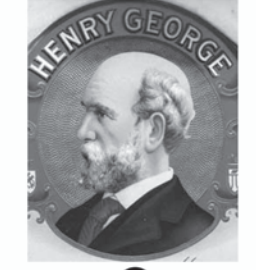

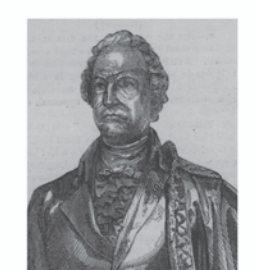

INFORMATION FOR VISITORS

GREEN-WOOD IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.
HOURS: 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. daily, weather permitting. Call or check our website for extended summer hours.
RULES OF THE CEMETERY: Green-Wood Cemetery is an active and working cemetery. Please be respectful of burials, cremations and those visiting loved ones.
PHOTOGRAPHY: is permitted at the discretion of the Cemetery security/officials and The Historic Fund officials. Professional photography (including any use of lights, stands or other equipment) is not permitted.
FILMING AND VIDEO TAPING is prohibited.
JOGGING AND BIKE RIDING in the Cemetery grounds is prohibited. Bike parking is available at all entrances.
MOTORCYCLES are prohibited.

PETS are not permitted on Cemetery grounds, with the exception of service animals.
FOOD, BEVERAGES and alcoholic beverages are prohibited on Cemetery grounds unless otherwise posted for special events.

FREE PARKING AVAILABLE. Please park all vehicles on the right hand side of the road. Parking on the grass is prohibited.

THE LOUD PLAYING OF RADIOS and other sound generating devices is prohibited.

THE SPEED LIMIT is a maximum 20 MPH.

DIRECTIONS

FROM LOWER MANHATTAN:
 Take Brooklyn Battery Tunnel and exit at Hamilton Avenue (immediately after toll plaza). Continue on Hamilton Avenue until it becomes Third Avenue and go about eight blocks to 25th Street. Turn left on 25th Street and go two blocks. Cemetery entrance is straight ahead at 5th Avenue and 25th Street.

FROM VERRAZANO-NARROWS BRIDGE:
 Take I-278 E / Gowanus Expressway to the 38th Street exit. At bottom of ramp, proceed straight one block to 5th Avenue. Turn left at 5th Avenue and continue 13 blocks to 25th Street. Cemetery entrance is on right.

FROM JFK AIRPORT:
 Take Belt Parkway west to I-278 E / Gowanus Expressway to the 38th Street exit. At bottom of ramp, proceed straight one block to 5th Avenue and continue 13 blocks to 25th Street. Cemetery entrance is on right.

FROM LONG ISLAND:
 Take Long Island Expressway west to the 48th Street exit to I-278 W / Brooklyn Queens Expressway south to the Hamilton Avenue exit. Continue on Hamilton Avenue until it becomes Third Avenue and go about eight blocks to 25th Street. Turn left on 25th Street and go two blocks. Cemetery entrance is straight ahead at 5th Avenue and 25th Street.

BY SUBWAY:
 Take the R train to 25th Street in Brooklyn. Walk east one block to Green-Wood at 5th Avenue and 25th Street.

Established in 1999, The Green-Wood Historic Fund's mission is to maintain Green-Wood Cemetery's monuments and buildings of historical, cultural and architectural significance; advance public knowledge and appreciation of their significance; and preserve the natural habitat and parklands of one of New York City's first green spaces. With funding from memberships and donations, The Historic Fund not only preserves the past to enrich our future, but maintains a vibrant presence by offering a wide array of open-to-the-public events, including themed walking and trolley tours, author book talks and special seasonal events. The Historic Fund has pioneered preservation efforts with *Street In Time*, a program that, since its inception in 2002, has stabilized and conserved several of the Cemetery's most critically deteriorating monuments. In partnership with local public schools, The Historic Fund offers educational programs using the Cemetery grounds as an outdoor classroom. The ever-expanding Historic Fund Collection helps interpret Green-Wood's history with photographs, artwork, documents and artifacts of the Cemetery and its permanent residents. Stories about many of these residents, as well as coverage of Historic Fund events and Green-Wood news, are published in *The Arch*, The Historic Fund's magazine. Our Historic Fund Bookstore offers books about Green-Wood, as well as best-selling and hard-to-find books about its famous and infamous inhabitants.

Founded in 1838 as one of America's first rural cemeteries, The Green-Wood Cemetery soon developed an international reputation for its magnificent beauty and became the fashionable place to be buried. By 1860, Green-Wood was attracting 500,000 visitors a year, rivaling Niagara Falls as the country's greatest tourist attraction. Crowds flocked to Green-Wood to enjoy family outings, carriage rides and sculpture viewing in the finest of first generation American landscapes. Green-Wood's popularity helped inspire the creation of public parks, including New York City's Central and Prospect Parks.

Today Green-Wood is 478 spectacular acres of hills, valleys, glacial ponds and winding paths, throughout which exists one of the largest outdoor collections of 19th- and 20th-century statuary and mausoleums. Four seasons of beauty from 7000 trees and many gardens offer a peaceful oasis to visitors, as well as to its 560,000 permanent residents, including Leonard Bernstein, Boss Tweed, Charles Ebbets, Jean-Michel Basquiat, Louis Comfort Tiffany, Horace Greeley, Civil War generals, baseball legends, politicians, artists, entertainers and inventors.

A magnet for history buffs and bird watchers, Green-Wood is a Revolutionary War historic site (the Battle of Brooklyn was fought in 1776 across what is now its grounds), a designated site on the Civil War Discovery Trail and a registered member of the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary System. In 2006, Green-Wood was designated a National Historic Landmark by the United States Department of the Interior.
