This is the layout of the attached maps. If you have questions, as to how it is supposed to all go together, please don't hesitate to call or email me.

There will be no burials in the Section 1. There will only be limited burials in Section 2. Section 3 and 4 are the currently active portions of the cemetery. These maps are for your use. Please use them for future reference when ordering foundations or burials. Should you desire a computerized copy, please send \$5.00 to cover the cost of the digital media, disk mailer and postage and include your address and it will be shipped to you within 2 weeks. If you prefer you can have it emailed to you at no charge by contacting me at bdann@twcny.rr.com.

In the attached Sections you will see that each grave is broke out into 4 cells. The top cell is the name of the person(s) who purchased the grave(s). The 2nd cell down is the family surname, or may be the name of the person to be buried in that cell. The third cell down is the name of the person to be buried there. The bottom cell is the map location. If the 2nd cell from the top cell is empty, that means that the person is buried there. If the cell is outlined in red and their name is in red, they have been buried. If there is no cell outline and their name is in black, they have not yet been buried. You can view detailed information in each cell by right clicking on the cell and selecting "Insert/Edit Comment". That is where I copy and paste online Obituary articles and information. That information can then be printed at the end of the printout for that section of the map. In the top cell you will also see Flags in some graves. That signifies that that person served in our Military. Names that are underlined have a hyperlink to more information such as photos, news articles, etc.
