The cemetery was plowed up to build the First Baptist Church of Schererville. It is believed the cemetery is still privately owned but the ownership is not definitely known. A Hobart attorney, William Demmon and his brother, Floyd, are descendants of the Demmons buried there. William Demmon said his great-grandfather's father-in-law was Stephen Wilcox.

The following is a paragraph from an article contributed by Deloris Niendorf from the Holmes County Heirs, Ohio Genealogical Society:

"Isaac Hague was born in Fayette Co, PA in 1796. He married Nancy Daughtery in 1818 and in 1828 they moved to Ripley Twp., Holmes Co., Ohio. He first purchased 160 acres of military land and soon added more. He became a successful farmer and also served the township as treasurer and trustee. Eight children were born to Isaac and Nancy. These were: Ruth, Jane, William, Sarah, Aaron, Elizabeth, Hannah and Isaac H. Isaac H. began practicing medicine with Dr. Joel Pomerine after graduating from Hiram College. He married Rebecca Williams and practiced in Nashville until 1877 when he moved to Shreve. Sarah married William McConkey and moved to Missouri. Elizabeth married James Miller and Hannah married Josiah Moreland. Both moved to Porter County, IN where they lived out their lives. Ruth married John Phillips and Jane married Stephen R. Williams (both remained in Holmes Co.) Aaron died at an early age."

CENSUS MICROFILM RENTAL - Valparaiso Library

Census and other microfilms can be ordered through the American Genealogical Lending Library in Bountiful, Utah for a \$2.50 rental fee, plus the 75 cents postage and insurance fee. Two separate payments must be made in advance: a check or money order for the rental fee of \$2.50 made out to the American Genealogical Lending Library and a payment of 75 cents to the Genealogy Dept. of the library. Films may be purchased at a price of \$11.00. Contact the desk for information on what is available other than census.
