The following is a paragraph from an article contributed by Deloris Niendorf from the Holmes County Heirs, Ohio Genealogical Society:

"Isaac Hague was born in Payette Co, PA in 1796. He married Nancy Daughtery in 1818 and in 1828 they moved to Ripley Twp., Holmes Co., Ohio. He first purchased 160 acres of military land and soon added more. He became a successful farmer and also served the township as treasurer and trustee. Eight children were born to Isaac and Nancy. These were: Ruth, Jane, William, Sarah, Aaron, Elizabeth, Hannah and Isaac H. Isaac H. Began practicing medicine with Dr. Joel Pomerine after graduating from Hiram College. He married Rebecca Williams and practiced in Nashville until 1877 when he moved to Shreve. Sarah married William McConkey and moved to Missouri. Elizabeth married James Miller and Hannah married Josiah Moreland. Both moved to Porter County, IN where they lived out their lives. Ruth married John Phillips and Jane married Stephen R. Williams (both remained in Holmes Co.) Aaron died at an early age."
