SUGG FAMILY CEMETERY

Location: Leave Russellville at the corner of Jackson St. and Alabama Highway 24. Drive east on 24 to US Highway 43. Turn right (south) and go 1.1 Mile. Turn left (east) and follow Alabama 24 for 4.5 miles; turn left (north) and go 1 mile; turn right (east) and go .4 mile; turn right thru a wire pasture fence gate and drive thru the pasture to the next fence row; turn left and follow to the cemetery.
9 marked graves. 7 stones badly broken, signs of about 25 graves.
