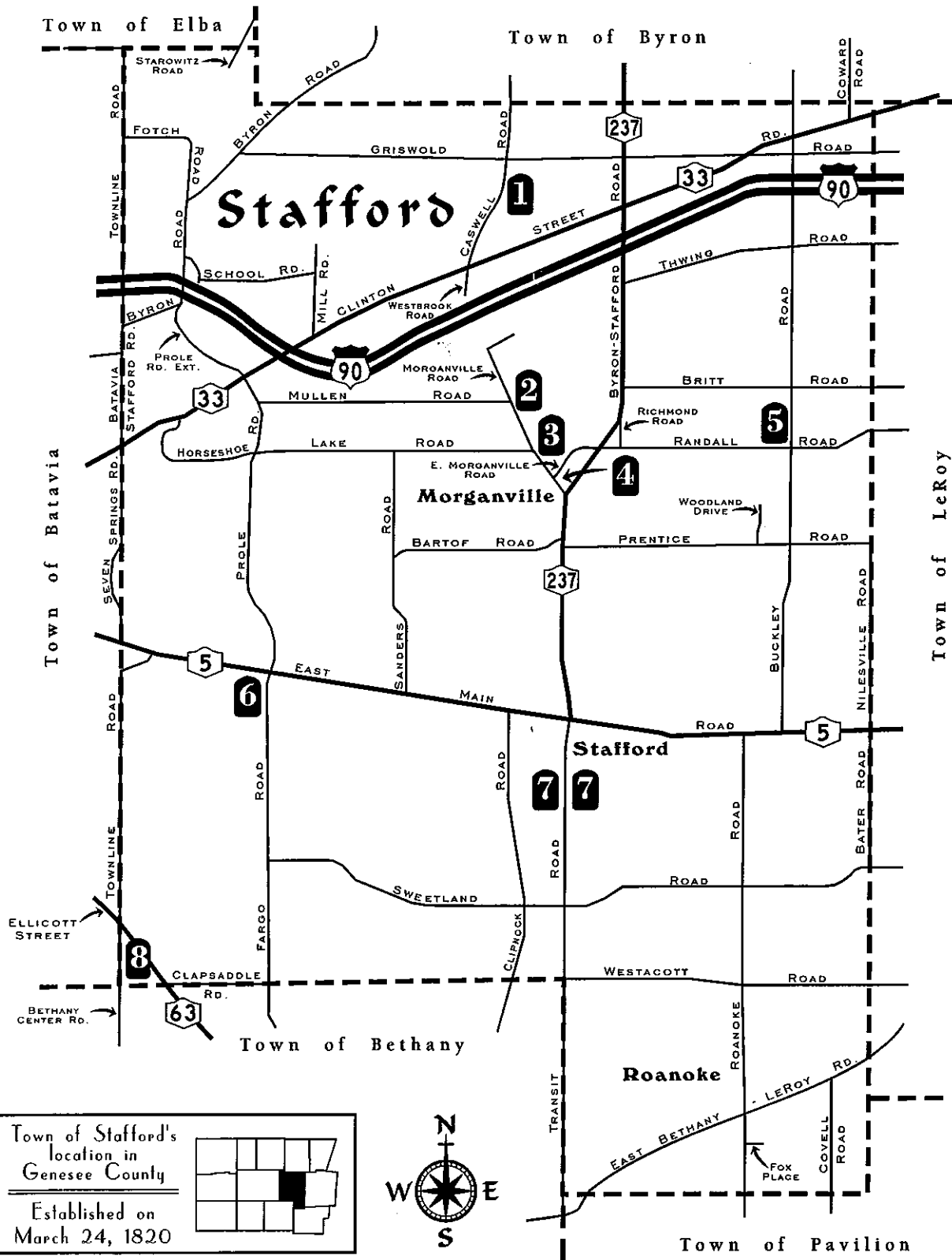



There is a map of the Town of Stafford on the next page.

Stafford Rural Cemetery

On the east side of Transit Road, south of Rt. 5

Incorporated active cemetery

First burial: 1867

Bartholf Family Ground (DeBow Cemetery)

100 yards east of junction of Ellicott Road with Batavia/Stafford
Townline Road and Bethany Center Road

Abandoned family burial ground - see: Cooley's, p.159

First burial: 1811 last 1845

Fargo Road Cemetery (Temperance Hill Cemetery, Pioneer or Old Cemetery)

On Fargo Road, off Rt. 5, east of Temperance Hill

Abandoned cemetery - See: Cooley's, p.160

Lathrop Family Plot (Daniels Farm Plot)

Morganville, opposite greenhouse, overgrown with brush

Abandoned - See: Cooley's, p.165

First burial: 1832 last: 1858

Randall Cemetery

North side of Randall Road, corner of Randall and Buckley Roads

Abandoned - See: Cooley's, p.166

First burial: 1830 last: 1931

Tyler Cemetery (Thompson Cemetery or Walkers Corners Cemetery)

East side of Caswell Road on a rise in a field

Abandoned - See: Cooley's, p.172

First burial: 1815 last: 1882

Morganville Cemetery

On east side of Morganville Road, directly opposite Horseshoe Lake Road

Incorporated active cemetery

First burial: 1810

Old Morganville Cemetery

Two hundred yards northeast of Morganville Cemetery in a pasture on the Flemming farm.
